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




While working as a receptionist, she played a game with herself: try to break him out of his shy and professional shell. Five years, a new job, and a promotion to manager later, Morgan, now a nurse, was encouraged by colleagues to finally ask Daniel out. Luckily, he accepted, and they've been inseparable ever since.

When it came to finding a venue for their January wedding, they fell in love with Main Street Ballroom. Morgan had spent time in her early 20s in Ellicott City, and Daniel fell in love with the small town when she showed him. The building on Historic Ellicott City's Main Street was once a Chevrolet dealership and workshop. Now, it's a modern industrial space with exposed stone, brick walls, and large windows illuminating the open interior. Daniel and Morgan's formal event was captivating against the urban and industrial elements.

Her Look

Little girls often dream of their wedding dress, but for Morgan, it was more about the shop. "I went [to the wedding dress shop in Savage Mill] with my father on service calls; he owned a local glass company." Though she didn't know it as a child, Cherie Sustainable Bridal sends proceeds to charity. After learning this during wedding dress shopping, Morgan was determined to find her dress there. She chose a fit and flare dress from the eclectic designer, Hayley Paige, covered in sequins. "The fabric looked like little snowflakes, and I fell in love."

The Accessories

Her Look

When Jennifer first began looking at dresses, she wasn’t sure what she wanted. Initially, she gravitated to simple, minimal gowns, but they just didn’t feel like her. On a visit to her hometown, she and her mom decided to stop into a boutique—the same one she bought her prom dress. She went in knowing she “wanted a ball gown for that classic, princess moment.” And though she tried simple versions of that, none of them were the one. His Look

Her Second Look

It’s what I’m known for at every party, wedding, or celebration.” The ball gown she chose to get married in wasn’t conducive to the moves she was planning to perform to Britney Spears. Their Entourage

Though green was a significant part of the wedding day color scheme, Jennifer feared bridesmaids in that color would blend too much with the lawn where the ceremony took place. After trying on dresses, Jennifer and the bridesmaids fell in love with a taupe champagne shade. Each bridesmaid showed off her personal style by choosing a different silhouette. A love story years in the making, Scott and Julia “supposedly” first met in French class in 7th grade. However, it wasn’t until high school that they officially connected thanks to mutual friends. Julia’s first impression of Scott was, “He’s so cute.” After he asked her to their senior prom, the pair started dating. Their decade-long relationship has featured a variety of milestones. Attending college seven hours apart, new careers, moving in together, buying their first home. “Those big life moments, and watching how each of us navigates them, became the new, more lasting impression [of each other].”

It was important that their venue reflected their creative backgrounds and passion for design. Scott and Julia hosted their February wedding at Citizens Ballroom. The historic bank in Frederick has been restored, featuring beautiful architectural details, including the original vault, marble fireplace, and pink marble flooring. Organic, architectural, and classic; exactly how their wedding felt from the decor to the fashion.

“We really wanted to lean into our style and make it feel like us, whether that was in the design of the florals, tousled French twist hairstyle, texture of my dress, or mixed fabric of Scott’s tuxedo.”



Her Look

Julia knew she wanted her bridal look to feature sleeves, “whether that was gloves, detached sleeves, or true sleeves.” While she didn’t want something with too much detail or intricate beading, she wanted an element of interest. After visiting five shops in Maryland, she expanded her search to D.C. At Lovely Bride, Julia fell in love with a sleek and sophisticated gown by Newwhite featuring a textured bodice and off-the-shoulder organza sleeves. A weird coincidence, Julia and her bridal stylist were wearing the same outfit at both of her appointments; “it felt like kismet.”



His Look

Scott liked the idea of wearing something unexpected. He considered green or velvet suits to stand out from the sea of black tuxedos they expected their guests to wear. Because they got married in the winter, they leaned into the “lushness” of the season and opted for a white suit jacket with a black shawl collar and a black velvet bowtie. Scott finished off the look with classic black tuxedo pants, olive green socks with tigers, and black leather loafers.

The Accessories

Describing herself as a “shoe girl,” Julia wanted something unexpected for her wedding day. She stumbled upon a pair of sky blue Simkhai heels that spoke to her. The satin pumps feature a pointed toe with crystal-encrusted slingback straps. “I hadn’t planned to do a colored shoe, but I loved them so much as soon as I saw them.” The crystal added an elegant touch that made them feel special.



Their Entourage

For her bridesmaids, Julia imagined a mix-and-match look but in a specific way. She pictured unique dresses that didn’t “scream ‘bridesmaid.’” To achieve this look, Julia turned to Canva, creating a presentation with about 50 dress options, with different colors, silhouettes, prints, and price points. Each bridesmaid chose her top three choices, and Julia made the final selection of dresses that would look best as a group. A mix of colors, textures, and patterns that put their creative organic vision on full display.

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Beauty routines are like a ritual. Practiced every day, customized to your needs. That ritual is even more amplified in the months before a wedding. Your pre-wedding beauty routine is a mix of self-care and finding the right vendors that will bring your bridal look to life. For that ultimate glow walking down the aisle, here's the timeline for the big three of beauty.

For Luscious Hair

When it comes to prepping your hair for your wedding, it starts with the condition. Whether it's dry, oily, or breaking off to start, most brides want shiny, smooth, and bouncy hair on their big day. "Moisture treatments and regular haircuts . . . just a trim to make sure there are no split ends" are the best place to start, says Sierra Billings from Blush Salon. Moisture treatments are meant to replenish and hydrate hair, which can help combat dry or frizzy locks by adding essential oils, nutrients, and deep hydration.

Now, if you've been thinking about making some changes to your hair before the big day, give yourself at least three months. Trying a new color, chopping off a few inches, or going with a new style entirely. Three months before the wedding will allow you to make any necessary adjustments and ensure you love your hair on your wedding day.

But for a regular color maintenance appointment, as you've done before, schedule it for a week and a half to two weeks before the wedding. "Coloring your hair two to four days before is risky business, even if it's a stylist you've been going to for months," Billings says. That two week mark ensures you have time to make adjustments if need be.

For those who might want to get their eyelashes or eyebrows done before their wedding, Billing recommends scheduling that first appointment six to twelve weeks before the wedding. This way, if you have allergic reactions, you'll know well in advance. And as long as you didn't have a bad reaction, you should schedule a pre-wedding brows and lashes appointment the week before your wedding.

At two or three months out from your wedding, you'll want to have your bridal hair trial. Bring inspiration photos for your hair stylist to work off of. "Also, bring any veils, headpieces, sparkles, or pearls that you would like to incorporate into your look," Billings says. She also suggests bringing pictures of your dress and wearing a white top to your trial. "So you can get an idea of what [your hair] would look like with your dress!"

For Flawless Makeup

Most brides-to-be are already on Pinterest searching for inspiration; and that's a perfect place to start. "Search for makeup styles you think would suit you best and that you would feel comfortable in," says Alicia, makeup artist with Beyond the Updo.

Search for makeup looks that complement your features and are similar to the level and style of makeup you already wear, whether you lean more natural or more glam. It's also important to book an artist or a team that aligns with your desired makeup style. Check out their portfolio to see what kind of makeup they usually do. And don't be afraid to ask about their style to see if it aligns with yours.

While you can search for makeup inspiration throughout your wedding planning process, it's recommended to book your artist early on, about eight to twelve months in advance, according to Alicia. "Even earlier if you're getting married in a popular month like May or October!"

About one to three months from your wedding date, you can book your makeup trial. Bring inspiration to show your artist. Point out the details you like and the ones you don't so your artist can make the necessary adjustments.

Alicia also emphasizes the importance of taking care of your skin. "I always suggest working closely with an aesthetician to figure out what works best for your skin leading up to your wedding." Healthy, hydrated skin will help you achieve that bridal glow and flawless makeup.

For Photo-Ready Skin

Skin care is the foundation of your wedding day beauty. A year out from your wedding, you may be looking for your venue and hiring your wedding planner. But the experts at Annapolis Aesthetics say that's also when your skin care journey should begin.

"Everyone's skin care goals are different. The more time, the better [especially] if peels, lasers and injectables are part of the treatment plan."

Nine to twelve months before your wedding, it's recommended to go to a licensed aesthetician for a consultation and create a plan for skin care treatments. And if you're planning to use at-home skin care products, start at least six months before the wedding day. "Many skin care products take six to twelve weeks to see an improvement and it's best to have extra time built in to try different things or more powerful ingredients."

Some powerhouse ingredients to look out for: "exosomes, growth factors, hyaluronic acid, and retinols," suggests Annapolis Aesthetics. Exosomes can help calm inflammation and increase collagen production. Growth factors, similarly, boost collagen production, leading to smoother wrinkles and firmer skin. You can expect to see a visual impact from these ingredients in about six weeks. "The longer and more consistently you use them, the more significant the collagen renewal you'll see."

After months of a diligent skincare routine, you're finally within weeks of the wedding. Now is the time to stay the course. While it may be tempting, adding a new treatment or products can cause unwanted irritation. To avoid irritation, redness, and swelling, it's also recommended to avoid facial waxing, threading, strong peels, lasers, or injectables in the final week leading up to your wedding.

"Maintain what's already working, and resist the urge to try anything new," Annapolis Aesthetics urges. "Avoid the sun, drink lots of water, and get a massage." A consistent care routine will help you achieve the radiant, photo-ready skin every bride wants.

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


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CONSERVATION THROUGH CELEBRATION

WEDDINGS THAT HELP SAVE THE BAY

Interview with Shannon Wright and
the Chesapeake Bay Foundation

THE CHESAPEAKE BAY is a centerpiece of Maryland geography. It's a quintessential sight to see boats of all kinds on the glistening blue waters and individuals enjoying the sandy shores. Restaurants and residences alike boast waterfront views. And you can't talk about Maryland's waterways without mentioning the crabs everyone loves to eat.

Many couples dream of having a wedding with the Chesapeake Bay as a backdrop. Venues throughout Annapolis and the Eastern Shore attract couples who want a picturesque, coastal wedding day. Picture light blues and creams, natural materials, and lush florals against the Bay's calming waters.

But it's often understated how important the Bay is. While many Marylanders enjoy these waters, the Chesapeake Bay Watershed stretches up into Pennsylvania and New York, covering an area of over 64,000 acres, where more than 18 million people live.





A CLEAN BAY IS A HAPPY BAY

With lush green foliage giving way to waves gently lapping onto sandy beaches, the Chesapeake Bay Foundation is a beautiful place to host a wedding. However, it's more than a wedding venue. It's the largest regional nonprofit dedicated to saving the Bay. Their main goal is to improve the Chesapeake Bay's water quality, which benefits both the area's ecosystem and its people.

The Bay's water quality affects everyday lives throughout the watershed, from the quality of drinking water to the abundance of locally-sourced food. The Chesapeake Bay Foundation emphasizes, "It's a critical resource people in the area rely on for their jobs, for their enjoyment, and for their general way of life."

Pollution and climate change challenge the health of the Bay. Species that are fixtures in these waters, like blue crabs and striped bass, are struggling. "People who rely on those critters and a clean Bay can suffer, too, if we don't reduce our pollution."

The Foundation focuses on "preventing pollution at its source." Through advocacy and, when needed, litigation, they tackle pollution from wastewater treatment plants, industry, farms, and urban and suburban areas. Their team is also hands-on in their restoration, planting trees, placing more oysters in the Bay's waters, and improving shoreline resiliency.



WEDDINGS CAN PROTECT THE BAY

The Phillip Merrill Environmental Center, located in Annapolis, is the Chesapeake Bay Foundation's headquarters and where weddings are held. Beyond being beautiful, it's the world's first LEED Platinum building. At the time it was built, about 20 years ago, the LEED committee only had a Gold standard certification. When the committee came to review the building, it exceeded the Gold requirements, prompting the LEED committee to create and award the Platinum standard to the Chesapeake Bay Foundation.



It's a critical resource people in the area rely on for their jobs, for their enjoyment, and for their general way of life.

The building produces about 135 kWh of electricity through the solar panels. It uses 80 percent less water than conventional buildings. And during the construction, they sought to disturb the land as little as possible, incorporating and protecting the surrounding native wetlands and wildlife habitats.

Shannon Wright, the Chesapeake Bay Foundation's Wedding and Events Manager, explains that weddings here contribute to Bay conservation as soon as they're booked. The revenue from hosting events goes right back to the Foundation and supporting its mission. But the Chesapeake Bay Foundation takes it a step further to create truly sustainable weddings.

The Foundation strives to produce as little waste as possible by recycling cardboard and paper products and composting food waste. Their team also swaps single-use plastic for compostable alternatives in the case of flatware and drinking glasses.

One of a wedding day's smallest details is prohibited on the grounds: confetti. Many couples opt to throw confetti as they recess down the aisle or exit from their reception. While confetti and loose glitter can make for unique photos, the small particles can pollute waterways and harm local wildlife. Small swaps and omissions like this can make an event much greener.





EVERY WEDDING CAN BE SUSTAINABLE

Making weddings more sustainable can be as simple as a few swaps. Eliminating single-use plastic is one. “With their favors, we’ve had folks that offered pint glasses to their guests or a fun metal cup with their wedding logo or their date,” Wright says of previous Chesapeake Bay Foundation couples. Guests can use these reusable glasses for water or drinks at the wedding, then take them home at the end of the night as a memento.

Vendors are one of the biggest impacts on wedding sustainability. “There are a lot of local florists that farm and grow flowers that are local to Maryland. That’s where [couples] are choosing to get their flowers. Beyond that, they’re not using floral foam, which is bad for the environment; they’re putting them in glass vessels [instead].” Opting for locally-grown flowers can help reduce carbon emissions, especially when compared to shipping out-of-season blooms. Similarly, opting for caterers who serve a farm-to-table menu with locally-sourced ingredients can make a wedding even more eco-friendly.



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Using recycled paper, seed paper, or digital invitations can help reduce waste leading up to the big day. Renting decor not only saves money but also prevents overconsumption and waste. And the most delicious way for a more sustainable wedding? Edible favors. Popcorn, cookies, and jars of sauces instead of trinkets reduce plastic waste and give your guests a way to continue enjoying your wedding in the days after.

The Chesapeake Bay Foundation has a commitment to planning sustainable weddings that protect the Bay. But if you’re getting married elsewhere in Maryland, sustainable swaps during the planning process can help protect these waters too.

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

"Additionally, we really invested in beautiful glasses and plates to tie the tablescape together."



"My favorite moment was when the doors of the venue opened up, "Ribbon in the Sky" by Stevie Wonder began to play and Taylor walked into the venue and everything was perfect. She looked so angelic at that moment," James says.

NOTES, MUSICAL AND OTHERWISE

The saxophone stole the show the entire night. "Saxophones are just so romantic to me and [it] set the mood immediately." The saxophonist played throughout the cocktail hour and accented the Amy Winehouse cover of "There's No Greater Love," which was James and Taylor's first dance. Another detail that added to the ambiance of the evening was the personalized seating chart, which featured handwritten notes for every guest. "We purchased handmade paper, printed each guest's name and table number, and added a gold wax seal. It truly amped the emotion in the air."

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



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


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
